#### **President Jim's** Message



THE INFO SPOT From March 2009

Baseball was introduced in Italy by American troops near the end of WWII. Anzio is known by most as the site of a great WWII battle, but the American cemetery there is also the birth place of baseball in Italy. American soldiers would recruit local youths to help in the burial details and then teach them to play baseball during their breaks. The Servicemen taught the Italian kids to hit, catch, throw, some of the basic rules of the game and actually played games watched by Italian people, and the seed was sown, The first Italian League Tournament was held in 1948, and was won by Bologna.

Italy's National Federation organizes, structures and manages the program, and the championship has been played non-stop since 1948. A total of 10 teams plan an approximate total of 54 games during the regular season from April to mid-September in what is known as the "A1" or Amateur No.1 League. This is the best league with the most talented players. The top four teams make the playoffs, which features the best of seven semifinals followed by a best of seven Italian Championship known as "Lo Scudetto." The tow teams with the worst record in A1 are demoted to

> A2 for the following season to be replaced by the two best A2 teams.

There are 24 A2 teams throughout Italy. Most are concentrated north of Florence, while a few are scattered around Grosseto, Nettuno, and in Sicily. There is also a third level, known as "B" level, which has 40 teams around the country, but is concentrated mainly in the North. An eight team winter league is also in the mix.

The A1 teams play three games a week against the same opponent.

The first game is played Friday at 9PM, and the two games are played Saturday, one at 4PM the other at 9PM. A minimum of three umpires call the game, usually four, and seven during the playoffs. Pitchers are allowed only three warm-up throws from the mound between innings.

Each team is allowed two to three non-Italian born players, with one often a starting pitcher. Non-Italian born pitchers can only pitch in Friday night games. In the first Saturday game, the starting pitchers must be Italian or Italian-American, and each team must play three players under the age of 23 at all times. The Saturday night game is limited to only Italian pitchers, but in this game there are no age restrictions. Each team carries a total of 23 players (20 Italian or Italian-Americans, and three foreigners). Almost all the team uniforms are laced with their main sponsors' logo, and most teams operate within a 500,000 Euro budget. Imagine that an entire Italian team operates on what is close to the base pay of a Major League player here in the states. Italian-born players are paid about \$40,000. Some super star big league players here in the states receive that much for each plate appearance.

You would think that in a country famous for its food you'd be able to indulge in pasta, sausage, cheese and wine while enjoying the game. Think again. Just about all that's offered is standard American ballpark eats and drinks like hot dogs and hamburgers, peanuts and Coca-Cola with an occasional Italian panino imbottito (sandwich) here and there. Gelato, however, is one specialty not to miss on a hot summer afternoon at the ballpark in

In August, Steve Delben's name was drawn and he was present and received \$70. The drawing for September will be back to \$25.


If your name is drawn and you are there, you get the money, so "be there" or miss your chance to win.
