President Jim's Message



Pres. Jim has been very busy, so we here is an Info Spot he wrote in February 2004.

THE INFO SPOT By Jim Nobili WINE (VINO)

This may seem a little far-fetched from a guy who serves most of you wine from a box, but hey, this is the Info Spot. I do, by the way, know how to "pop" a cork when the opportunity of occasion arises.

There are, according to "wine experts" six main classes of wine. They are appetizer wines, red wines, rose' (pink) wines, white wines, dessert wines and sparkling wines. Many wine connoisseurs base these classifications on when and where these wines should be served. Most of these ideas are commonly accepted, however your own personal taste plays the most important part in the enjoyment of the wine. Cork, box or screw top and whatever wine you prefer can be enjoyed at any time. We'll take a brief look at what "they" say.

Appetizer Wines. These wines are ujsually served alone or with an antipasto before the main meal. Alcohol content usually ranges from 15 to 20 percent. The favorite appetizer wines are sherry and vermouth. They vary in taste from sweet to dry (nonsweet). Some folks think that sweet interferes with the flavor of food, so prefer the drier wine.

Red Table Wines. Most of these wines have a hearty flavor that goes very well with main-course dishes like red meats, game, pasta (not that Alfredo stuff), and foods that are highly seasoned. Alcohol content ranges from about 8 to 15 ercent. Popular red wines include burgundy, Claret, Chianti, Pinot Noir, Merlot, Cabernet, Zinfandel and of course many others. These wines are served

unchilled. I find that a temperature in the low sixties tastes best to me.

Rose' Table Wines. The best ones are made from a Grenache grape. They're pretty much an all--purpose wine and can be used with any type of food. Rose' wines are served chilled. Alcohol content is about 8 to 15 percent.

White Table Wines. These wines range in color from pale to deep gold and vary in taste from sweet to dry. They are generally served with chicken, fish and maybe that Alfredo stujff. Some of the favorite ones are Chablis, Rhhine, Sauterne, Chenin Blanc and Chardonnay. These wines are served chilled and also have an alcohol content of 8 to 15 percent.

Dessert Wines. These wines are sweet, rich wines. They hare often served with dessert or alone. Alcohol content is about 15 to 20 percent. They are served unchilled. Some of the favorites are Madeira, Muscatel, Port and sweet Sherry.

Sparkling Wines. These wines bubble and sparkle because they contain carbon dioxide gas. They can be served with any food or any time, but most often used to celebrate festive occasions. Alcohol content in these wines is about 10 to 14 percent and they are served chilled. Champagne, of course, is the most famous of these wines, but there are many sparkling winces on the market Until next time, Ciao.



Senior Legislators then seek state lawmakers to author 10 of the Session's priority proposals. The CSL works throughout the year to ensure adoption of these proposals.

We are the Redding Grange #446



Over the years I have had the opportunity to research some of the history of our Redding Grange. I have looked through county records and documents that have been archived by earlier Redding Grange members. I also had access to the archived documents of the California State Grange/CSG. One document that I found particularly interesting had to do with the CSG promoting the construction of Shasta Dam way back in 1929

While there had been some discussions regarding the construction of a dam in the area as early as 1919, nothing ever came of it. Redding was the site of the California State Granges" 57th Annual Session in 1929. This is like the SDOI convention with members coming from all over the state to participate. The Journal of Proceeding for this event states it was "Held in Moose Hall". The National Grange, the State, and local Grange members are all encouraged to generate resolutions at these sessions for the benefit of their local communities and their states.

At the Redding session one resolution was proposed and accepted promotion the "building of a dam at Kennet, to supply water for irrigation for both the Sacramento and San Joaquin Valleys and provide extensive power development." The California State Grange was, therefore, the first big statewide organization to promote the construction of Shasta Dam. This proposal was subsequently sent to the state legislature. The Granges across the country, and certainly in California, were much bigger than they are today, and they were listened to.

I thought that was pretty cool.
